**Job Description**

12 month tenure track faculty position at the assistant professor level in the Department of Clinical Sciences.

**Qualifications**

- DVM or equivalent veterinary professional degree.
- Diplomate status in the American College of Theriogenologists (ACT) is required.
- An advanced graduate degree or equivalent research experience is desirable.
- Experience instructing veterinary students and residents in the reproductive management of horses is desirable.

**Specific Responsibilities**

**Teaching**

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- **Clinical:** Provide active instruction to junior and senior Professional Veterinary Medical Students (PVM) in the clinical service environment (see Service and Outreach). Participate in the clinical training of Equine Theriogenology residents and education of other students (graduate and undergraduate students) at the Equine Reproduction Laboratory.
- **Didactic:** Provide lecture and laboratory instruction for the PVM curriculum on topics related to general theriogenology and equine theriogenology. Active participation in lectures and laboratory activities in the Foaling Management course is also expected. Participation in graduate level courses is also encouraged.
- **Graduate Training:** Participate in the advising, mentoring, and instruction of Equine Theriogenology residents and other graduate students within a program involving the area of the successful candidate's research interests and expertise.

**Research**

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- Develop an independent and/or collaborative research program in the discipline of equine theriogenology
- Develop and obtain internal and external funding to support an active research program.

**Service and Outreach**

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- **Clinical Service:** Provide 26 weeks per year of coordination and direct clinical activity in the Equine Theriogenology service at the Equine Reproduction Laboratory. Provide Equine Theriogenology clinical support at the Veterinary Teaching Hospital.
- **Outreach:** Provide consultation for veterinarians in Colorado and other states. Develop and participate in professional continuing education for veterinarians and the equine industry.
- **Administrative:** Participate in Departmental, College, and University administrative committees as well as active participation in the organization and implementation of the goals for the Equine Reproduction Laboratory and the Equine Section of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital.
