12 month special appointment faculty position (non-tenure track) at the assistant professor level in the Department of Clinical Sciences

**Qualifications**

- DVM or equivalent veterinary professional degree
- Experience in both general and tertiary level care of neurology cases
- Diplomate board certification in the neurology specialty of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM) or in the European College of Veterinary Neurology (ECVN) is preferred.
- Clinical or basic science research experience is desirable.
- Experience in instructing veterinary students, interns, and residents in the medical and surgical management of neurology cases is desirable.

**Specific Responsibilities**

**Teaching**

---

- **Clinical:** Provide active clinical instruction to junior and senior Professional Veterinary Medical Students (PVM) in the clinical service environment (see Service and Outreach) and to participate in the clinical training of interns and residents when they rotate through the neurology service.
- **Didactic:** Provide lecture and laboratory instruction for the PVM curriculum on topics related to neurology. Participation in graduate level courses is also expected.
- **Graduate Training:** To participate in the advising, mentoring, and instruction of residents, and other graduate students whose interests coincide with the areas of interests of the successful candidate.

**Research**

- The opportunity to participate in or develop a research program is available.

**Service and Outreach**

---

- **Clinical Service:** Provide organization and supervision of the clinical rotation of the hospital neurology service. The clinical activity includes both medical and surgical cases and generalist level and tertiary level cases are seen. The number of clinical duty weeks to be provided will be determined according to the interests and experience of the selected candidate
- **Outreach:** Provide consultations for veterinarians in Colorado and other states. Develop and participate in professional continuing education for veterinarians.
