

**Colorado State University**

**Undergraduate Scholarships**

To apply for undergraduate scholarships in the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences (CVMBS), complete the CSU Scholarship Application (CSUSA) available on RAMweb beginning December 1. The deadline for submission of a complete application is March 1 at 11:00 p.m. (MST). Go to [ramweb.colostate.edu](http://ramweb.colostate.edu) and login using your eID. Then select the CSU Scholarship Application link. To be considered for need-based scholarships through the CSUSA, your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be submitted no later than March 1. (Please see the C.S.U. Student Financial Services website: [www.sfs.colostate.edu](http://www.sfs.colostate.edu) for complete information.) **BE CERTAIN** that you complete the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences section of the CSUSA as well as the initial general sections of the application.

John R. Bagby Scholarship	1 @ \$550	Undergrad	Undergrad majoring in Environmental Health; overall GPA of 3.0; based on student's involvement in service activities, work with faculty and peers
Biomedical Sciences Undergraduate Scholarship	3 @ \$1,500	Undergrad	Biomedical Sciences major; one award to 2nd year student (30-59 credits), one award to a 3rd year student (60-89 credits) and one award to a 4th year student (90+ credits); full-time student (12 credits or more); merit-based - selection based on academic factors such as C.S.U. GPA, high school GPA, ACT/SAT scores. Non-renewable, must reapply. Students must receive at least a 3.0 GPA at end of Fall Semester to be eligible for Spring Semester portion of the scholarship.
Beulah and Doyle Blair Memorial Scholarship	1 @ \$2,500	Undergrad	Undergrad in Microbiology; financial need; good academic standing; interest in and aptitude for pursuing microbiology research.
Colorado Environmental Health Association Scholarship (CEHA)	1 @ \$1,200	Undergrad - Jr, Sr	Financial need, good standing in Environmental Health program, demonstrate interest in EH issues by active participation in student, state &/or national Environmental Health organizations.
Environmental Health Undergraduate Scholarship	3 @ \$1,500	Undergrad	Entering freshman or continuing student, pursuing Environmental Health degree, based on H.S. grades & ACT or SAT scores, maintaining a 3.0+ GPA.
ERHS Freshman Scholars Program	5 @ \$1,500	Undergrad	Incoming CSU freshmen with outstanding GPA and other entrance credentials. Strong interest in participating in cutting-edge research programs and interacting with faculty mentors, graduate students and others within the freshmen scholars class. Career goals focused on the environmental and radiological health sciences with specific interests in programs and areas included in the ERHS Department.
Pamela Hill Griffith Memorial Scholarship	1 @ \$2,100	Undergrad - Junior, Senior	Microbiology major, good academic standing, financial need, provide service to Dept. of Microbiology, Immunology and Pathology, e.g. membership in Microbiology Student Association.
Imagine the Possibilities...100 Year Anniversary Scholarship	3 @ \$2,500	Undergrad	Awarded to full-time Undergraduate student, <b>one student from each of the areas of: 1) BMS, 2) ERHS, and 3) MIP</b> . Award will be based on GPA, financial need, first generation status, campus activities, community service, and career goals.
Barbara Joyce Microbiology Scholarship	1 @ \$1,500	Undergrad	Microbiology major, financial need, minimum 3.3 GPA, having completed a minimum of 36 credits, demonstrated academic achievement, involvement in outside activities, and interest in a career in human medicine.
Myron Brown Ludlow Scholarship	1 @ \$7,000	Undergrad - Soph, Jr, Sr	Full-time male sophomore, junior, or senior student; must have attended CSU one full academic year prior to receiving this scholarship; based on financial need and academic achievement.

Microbiology Undergraduate Scholarship	3 @ \$1,500	Undergrad	Entering freshman or continuing student pursuing the Microbiology degree; selection based on high school grades and ACT or SAT scores; full-time student; maintain GPA of at least 3.0.
Sumner M. Morrison Memorial Scholarship	1 @ \$3,200	Undergrad - Junior	Microbiology major, minimum 3.0 GPA, involvement in outside activities & potential for achievement in graduate studies.
Rowena Odell Scholarship	2 @ \$2,500	Undergrad	In financial need, enrolled full-time in College of Veterinary Medicine And Biomedical Sciences. (Historically awarded as one to ERHS and one to MIP.)
Delano F. Scott Scholarship	4 @ \$1,300	Undergrad - Soph, Jr, Sr	Male, based on need & demonstrated academic ability.
Students First Scholarship	1 @ \$1,000	Undergrad	Enrolled full-time in undergraduate degree program, any class and any major; good academic standing; financial need est. by Student Financial Services; active participant in campus and/or community service organizations, i.e. Office of Student Leadership Involvement and Community Engagement, etc.

Torgersen Memorial Scholarship	1 @ \$1,850	Undergrad - Jr, Sr	Microbiology student, good academic standing, financial need, just started the microbiology curriculum & recently completed MB300/MB302 & must have demonstrated enthusiasm for microbiology, independent & creative thinking. Based on promise & attitude rather than GPA.
Dr. Alan Tucker Memorial Scholarship	1 @ \$1,700	Undergrad	Biomedical Sciences major, primary consideration to student from a culturally diverse background, secondary consideration to a first generation student, financial need, good academic standing; essay on the value of higher education.
