CMB students in their 3rd year and above are required to present a poster. CMB 2nd year students are encouraged to present a poster.

All accepted abstracts will be compiled into a PDF file that will be distributed through the CMB website. The abstract must contain a title, list of authors, department and graduate program affiliation(s), and text of not more than 300 words, as well as a clear description of the objectives, experimental design or procedures, findings, and conclusions. The abstract must be typed using 12 pt Arial font, single spaced with one-inch margins, and fit on a single sheet of paper USING THE FOLLOWING FORMAT:
