ANNOUNCEMENT

The Summer Program for Veterinary Students will be offered during June through August of 2012 at the Tulane National Primate Research Center, Covington, Louisiana. The Center is located on a total of 500 wooded acres in Covington, Louisiana, 30 miles north of New Orleans.

Participants have the opportunity to explore research-oriented careers in clinical and experimental veterinary medicine, anatomic and clinical pathology and/ or laboratory-based research. Most students choose to work in either the Division of Veterinary Medicine or in the Division of Comparative Pathology, but additional opportunities exist in other research divisions. Students will be exposed to all aspects of veterinary medicine in the research environment including regulatory compliance, colony health surveillance, provision of research support, and nonhuman primate medicine, surgery, and pathology. Participants are required to present case reports or results of their research project at the End of Summer Research Symposium.

We generally prefer to select students who are in their second to fourth-year of veterinary school. The successful candidate will receive \$14.56 per hour, based on a 37.5 hr week, for a maximum of three months.
